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Who we are and what we do



We are **Swansea Bay University Health Board (Swansea Bay UHB)**.



We run NHS services for people living in:

- Neath
- Port Talbot
- Swansea



We also run some specialist services for people who live further away.



We plan services from:

- Family Doctors (GP's)
- Dentists
- Chemists
- District Nurses
- Therapists
- School Nurses
- Health Visitors



To plan our services, we work closely with:



- Patients, families and carers
- The Ambulance Service
- Local Authorities (Councils)



- Universities
- Charities

Introduction



This document is about changes to **Orthopaedic services** for some Swansea Bay residents.



Swansea Bay residents are people who live in:

- Swansea or
- Neath Port Talbot



Orthopaedic services provide treatment and operations to people who have problems with their:

Bones



Joints

We help people who:



have had problems for a long time and



- people who need operations like:
 - Hip replacements and
 - Knee replacements.



This is called **planned Orthopaedics**.



We also help people who have broken bones. This is called **Trauma**.



We have Orthopaedic services at:

- Morriston Hospital.
- Singleton Hospital.
- Neath Port Talbot Hospital.



Which hospital you go to depends on the type of treatment you need.



We have made plans to change the way we run Orthopaedic services so that:



People don't have to wait so long for treatment.



 All Swansea Bay residents can have the same Orthopaedic services when they need them.



We want to know what you think about the changes we are planning for our orthopaedic services.

Why we need to make changes to Orthopaedic services



1.Boundary changes

In 2019 the health board boundary changed. A boundary is the line that separates one area from another.





 Most Swansea Bay residents get their NHS services from us (Swansea Bay UHB).



- Most people living in and around:
 - Bridgend
 - Merthyr Tydfil
 - Rhondda Cynon Taf



get their NHS services from **Cwm Taf Morgannwg University Health Board (CTM)**.



Sometimes GP's **refer** Swansea Bay residents to **CTM Orthopaedic services**.

Refer means to write to a health service and ask them to see you.



This means they will be on the CTM Orthopaedics waiting list.



The waiting list for Orthopaedic services in CTM is not long.



Our waiting list for Orthopaedic services is longer.



2.COVID-19

We had to stop all Orthopaedic operations during the COVID-19 pandemic. This means there are even more people waiting for appointments now.

What happens if you have been referred to Orthopaedic services

If you have problems with your bones or joints now:



Your GP will refer you to Orthopaedic services.



 You will have an outpatients appointment at Neath Port Talbot Hospital.



An **Outpatients appointment** is an appointment at the hospital when you don't have to stay the night.



This is the same whether you have been **referred** to us or to CTM.

If you need an operation:



 You will go on our waiting list if you have been referred to us.



 You will go on to the CTM waiting list if you have been referred to them.

Where you will have your operation



If you need a simple operation, you will have it at Neath Port Talbot Hospital.



If you need an operation on your hand, you are most likely to have it at Singleton Hospital.



This is the same whether you have been **referred** to us or to CTM.



If you need a more complicated operation, you will have it at:

- Morriston Hospital if you have been referred to us.
- Princess of Wales hospital if you have been referred to CTM.

What are the difficulties?



Swansea Bay UHB and CTM both use Neath Port Talbot Hospital for simple Orthopaedic operations.





- One of our **surgeon's** if you were **referred** to us.



- A CTM **surgeon** if you were **referred** to them.

A **Surgeon** is a doctor who is specially trained to do medical operations.



 You will have treatment more quickly if you are referred to CTM.



This is because their waiting list is shorter.




 Swansea Bay residents who are referred to CTM do not have access to all our Orthopaedic services.

For example: If you are **referred** to **CTM** you will **not** have access to **our** Orthopaedic Prehab service. This service offers:



Exercise classes



Help with pain

Advice about weight loss

Our suggestions for changing Orthopaedic services

We want to make sure all Swansea Bay residents:



 Have their Orthopaedic treatment as quickly as possible.



Are able to access all of our Orthopaedic services.



At the moment, CTM use the **operating theatres** at Neath Port Talbot hospital for 13 sessions a week.

An **Operating theatre** is a room in a hospital where operations are done



We have talked to CTM and we have agreed:



 They will give us 6 of their operating theatre sessions a week.



• If you are a Swansea Bay resident who needs Orthopaedic services, you will:



- Move on to our waiting list if you have already been referred to CTM.



 Always go on to our waiting list if you are referred in the future.

What this means for you in future

If you are a Swansea Bay resident and you need Orthopaedic services, you will:



 Be sent an Outpatient's appointment at Neath Port Talbot Hospital.



• If you need an operation you will:



- Go on to our Orthopaedic waiting list.



- See one of our surgeons.



- Go to Neath Port Talbot Hospital if your operation is simple.



- Go to Morriston Hospital if your operation is more complicated.



- Have the support you need after your operation from us.



 Any letters or information about your treatment will come from Swansea Bay UHB.

How you may benefit from the changes for Orthopaedic services:



 By 2024 no one will have to wait more than 2 years for Orthopaedic treatment.



 All Swansea Bay residents will have access to the same Orthopaedic services.



- All Swansea Bay residents will be able to have their treatment and operation closer to their home.



 More staff will be employed to support our Orthopaedic services.



No staff will lose their jobs.



Staff will not have to work somewhere different.

How you may not benefit from the changes for Orthopaedic services:



 Some people will need to wait a bit longer for their treatment at first.

Equality



We need to make sure our plans for Orthopaedic services support everyone in our communities, including people:



- Who are older
- Have less money than others.
- With different:
 - Sexual preferences
 - Religions or beliefs
 - Abilities
 - Race, colour and ethnicity.
