

## Introduction



This document is about changes to our **Hydrotherapy** services.



**Hydrotherapy** is a treatment for some health problems using movement in a special pool. **Hydrotherapy** sessions are run by a Physiotherapist.



Many people find it easier to do exercises in water.



A **Hydrotherapy** pool is special because:

- The water is warmer which helps with:
  - Pain
  - Relaxation



 Access is easier for people with disabilities. For example, a hoist is available.

A **Hoist** is equipment used to lift and lower people who are unable to move by themselves.



We want to make some changes to provide the best **Hydrotherapy** service we can.



We want to know what you think about our plans.

# **Our Hydrotherapy Service**

We have 3 Hydrotherapy pools. One at each of our main hospitals which are:



- Morriston Hospital
- Singleton Hospital
- Neath Port Talbot Hospital



All our **Hydrotherapy** pools are different.



#### **Morriston Hospital Hydrotherapy pool:**

- is our oldest pool
- 8 people can use it at the same time
- access to the pool is difficult.



#### Singleton Hospital Hydrotherapy pool:

- 6 people can use it at the same time
- disabled parking is available
- access is easy
- community groups and charities can use it in the evenings.



#### **Neath Port Talbot Hospital Hydrotherapy pool:**

- is our newest pool
- 3 people can use it at the same time
- access is easy.

## **Hydrotherapy Before COVID-19**



All our pools were open for up to 6 hours Monday to Friday.



Many of the **Hydrotherapy** sessions were not used.



It is expensive to keep a pool open when it is not being used.

# How COVID-19 affected Hydrotherapy services

#### **During the COVID-19 pandemic:**



 The Government advised that all 3 pools had to close.



 The pools at Singleton and Neath Port Talbot Hospitals were safe to open again in May 2021.



They have been open for 7 hours a day.




Both these pools have been used all day, every day.



• The pool at Morriston is not safe to open. It is still closed.



 Everyone has been able to have Hydrotherapy if they needed it during COVID-19 since May 2021.



These changes gave us ideas to improve our **Hydrotherapy** service for the future.

# Our plan for Hydrotherapy services after COVID-19



 The pool at Morriston Hospital will close permanently.



 Patients staying in hospital will use the pool at Neath Port Talbot Hospital.



- Patients travelling to hospital for Hydrotherapy will go to the pool nearest their home. Either at:
  - Neath Port Talbot Hospital or
  - Singleton Hospital.




- Community groups and charities will be able to use the pools at:
  - Neath Port Talbot Hospital and
  - Singleton Hospital.

We will improve our Hydrotherapy services at both the pools by:



Keeping them open for up to 10 hours a day.



Thinking about making the pools available at weekends.



 Training more Physiotherapists to support the Hydrotherapy service.



 Working with local leisure centres to offer similar services in their swimming pools.



 Thinking about how people get to Hydrotherapy sessions if they don't have a car.



 Buying a new hoist for the pool at Singleton Hospital.



 Fitting a new heating and hot water system at Singleton Hydrotherapy pool.

# Advantages and Disadvantages of our plans for Hydrotherapy services.

#### The advantages of these changes will be:



Easier access to Hydrotherapy pools.



 More patients will be able to have Hydrotherapy treatment.



 More staff will be trained to support Hydrotherapy sessions.



 More opportunities for groups to use both Hydrotherapy pools at evenings and weekends.



 Opportunities for people to continue to exercise in a pool at their local leisure centre.



- **Hydrotherapy** services will be closer to home for some people.

#### The disadvantages of these changes will be:



 Some people will have further to travel to Hydrotherapy.



- Patients staying at Morriston Hospital will not be able to have Hydrotherapy until:
  - they are back at home or
  - they move to Neath Port Talbot Hospital to finish their treatment.



This will affect a very small number of patients.
