As part of our programme of local audit work at Public Health Wales NHS Trust (PHW), we have reported on collaborative arrangements for managing local public health resources. A consolidated NHS Wales management response has been developed, coordinated by PHW in collaboration with health boards and Welsh Government. The report and management response were considered at PHW's Audit Committee 19 October 2017 and we would expect Audit (or other appropriate) Committees at Health Boards to receive the report and management response, and to debate the action required as appropriate.

Good practice

- In addition to the audit work set out above, we continue to seek opportunities for finding and sharing good practice from all-Wales audit work through our forward planning, programme design and good practice research. Our Good Practice Exchange (GPX) team also facilitates a programme of shared learning events, details of which can be found on the GPX website.
- Future events include <u>a discharge planning shared learning event</u> entitled 'I'm a patient, get me out of here' planned for March 2018.

NHS-related national studies

- The Audit Committee may also be interested in the programme of national value for money studies, some of which focus on the NHS and pan-public-sector topics. These studies are typically funded by the National Assembly and are presented to the National Assembly's Public Accounts Committee to support its scrutiny of public expenditure.
- 9 Exhibit 6 provides information on the NHS-related or relevant national studies published in the last 12 months. It also includes all-Wales summaries of work undertaken locally in the NHS. Since our last update to the Audit Committee we would like to highlight the following:
 - The publication of a checklist to support NHS board members seek assurance on how local district nursing resources are managed and on the progress made since the Auditor General's 2014 review of district nursing services. We are aware that since our local follow-up audits, progress has been made in some areas, new legislation and guidance³ issued, and the Wales Community Care Information System introduced. However, it remains important that health boards have assurance that district nursing resources, which make up a substantial part of the community nursing workforce, are used to best effect within community services provision.
 - The Auditor General intends publishing his report on Informatics systems in NHS Wales in January 2018.
