CORPORATE GOVERNANCE REPORT

1. INTRODUCTION

To report on corporate governance matters arising since the previous meeting.

2. BACKGROUND

There are a number of corporate governance matters which have to be reported to the board as a regular item in-line with standing orders. This report encompasses all such issues as one agenda item.

3. GOVERNANCE AND RISK ISSUES

(i) Matters Considered In-Committee

In accordance with standing orders, the health board is required to report any decisions made in private session, to the next available public meeting of the board.

The following items during the in-committee board session in July 2021:

- Key Issues Report from In-Committee Board Committee meetings a report on key issues discussed at recent meetings was received for assurance:
- Chair's Actions three separate actions were received for ratification;
- Complex Complaint verbal update was provided by Christine Williams, Interim Director of Nursing and Patient Experience and Pam Wenger, Director of Corporate Governance.
- A presentation on the review of cardiac services was received for assurance.
- A presentation to agree the establishment of additional theatres at Neath and Port Talbot and Singleton Hospitals was received for approval subject to the outcome of the public engagement.

(ii) Affixing the Common Seal

In-line with standing orders, a routine report on documents to which the common seal has been affixed is required. Attached at **appendix 1** are details taken from the seal register. The Corporate Governance Team are currently reviewing the process regarding affixing the common seal.

(iii) Welsh Health Circulars (WHCs)

Welsh Government issues WHCs around specific topics. The WHCs set out in **appendix 2** have been received since the last meeting and are available via the <u>Welsh Government website</u>, where further details as to the risks and governance issues are available.

(iv) Board Business Cycle

At each meeting, the board receives copy of its business cycle which outlines the business planned for each meeting. This is at **appendix 3.**

(v) Standing Orders

Minor changes to the standing orders have been agreed by the Audit Committee for onward approval by the board:

- a. Reinstating Standing Orders Following Temporary Changes
 In order to maintain good governance during the pandemic, temporary variation was needed to the standing orders to enable decisions to be made at pace and to allow the board and committees to continue to discharge their responsibilities in light of the restrictions around meetings. The temporary changes are set out in **appendix four** and now that governance arrangements are back to full strength, it is proposed that these be stood-down and standing orders be returned to the original arrangements.
- b. <u>WHSSC</u> (Welsh Health Specialised Services Committee) Standing Orders In May 2021, Welsh Government issued updated model standing orders and standing financial instructions on which NHS Wales organisations base their own documents. Amendments were agreed to the health board's standing orders that same month to reflect these. Those of the joint committees are now in the process of being issued to organisations for inclusion, starting with WHSSC and these are at **appendix five, six and seven** in the resources folder for approval.

(vi) WHSSC Commissioning Future New Services for Mid, South and West Wales

At the WHSSC Joint Committee on 7th September 2021, members supported the delegation of the commissioning responsibilities for Hepato-Pancreato-Biliary (HPB) Services and Hepato-Cellular Carcinoma (HCC) multi-disciplinary team (MDT) services. The recommendation to develop a service specification for specialised paediatric orthopaedic surgery was also supported as well as the delegation (in principle) of the commissioning responsibilities for paediatric orthopaedic surgery. On that basis, commissioning health boards, including Swansea Bay, are asked to approve delegated commissioning authority to WHSSC. More detail is set out in **appendix eight** in the resources folder. It was also agreed by the joint committee that WHSSC would commission a spinal services operational delivery network on behalf of the six health boards in mid, south and west Wales with the required funding through the 2022-25 integrated commissioning plan.

(vii) Committee Annual Report

An integrated committee annual report has been developed to cover the breadth of each committee into one report for 2020-21 instead of individual reports. The committee chairs have been sighted on the committee annual report (appendix nine) and have provided comments and the final version is at appendix nine for approval.

(viii) Committee's Terms of Reference

Following a review by lead executive's and chairs of the Health Board's committees, comments have been received updating the Terms of Reference for each committee. The updated terms of reference have been submitted to Board for approval **(appendix ten).**
