	The risk assessments have been taking place since December 2021 and the Health Board is in receipt of draft reports for each of its properties which are being reviewed for accuracy. Meetings are scheduled later this month to discuss the changes required with regards accuracy within the reports.

### WATER RISK ASSESSMENT

### 1. INTRODUCTION

The water risk assessment forms part of the 'core' Estates information required by the Health & Safety at Work Act and the Approved Code of Practice L8 and is the basis upon which the water management systems are monitored and maintained. It provides detailed analysis of the risks within the Estate from which an action plan can be formulated to address these issues.

The prime purpose of carrying out the water risk assessment is to help in the operational and strategic management of the Health Board's water systems. The data provides detail of the issues that need to be addressed.

The plan was to complete the review by the end of financial year 2021/22. The plan has slipped slightly and the Health Board is currently reviewing the completed documentation for accuracy and is holding meetings with the specialist consultant engaged to undertake the risk assessments before the end of the month to finalise the changes required. From these risk assessments the Water Management Committee will develop the action plan for the coming year.

### 2. BACKGROUND

The Health Board undertook a tendering exercise for the provision of the water risk assessments at the end of 2021. HBI were appointed following a competitive tendering exercise. It is envisaged that the risk assessments will identify the key risks within the water systems.
