### 1.0 Situation

As part of the emerging 2018-19 financial plan, the Board agreed to the establishment of an internal Investment Fund to support service transformation. This paper sets out more detailed proposals relating to the development and operation of the Fund.

### 1.0 Background

The establishment of the Investment Fund is intended to pump prime new developments to support the organisation's recovery and sustainability, and is intended to align to and complement the Welsh Government's Invest to Save and Efficiency Through Technology Funds. It will allow rapid local investment in key priorities, alongside the development of a pipeline that can be geared up quickly and is scalable depending on the availability of funding either at a local or national level.

#### 2.0 Assessment

The key features of the proposed Fund are set out below:

**Purpose:** To support service and organisational transformation, by delivering new or different proven ways of working. In particular, to support key aspects of the recovery and sustainability agenda through improvement and greater efficiency.

**Investment criteria:** These are aligned to the Welsh Government criteria, based around four themes – problem/ proposal/ people/ plan – but will also include an underpinning requirement for projects to demonstrate the commitment to improving quality and patient safety. Further details of the four themes are attached at Annex 1.

**Funding**: The draft financial plan provides an initial allocation of £1m revenue funding in 2018-19. However there could be scope to increase this further, subject to the maturity and deliverability of emerging proposals, and we will be keeping the funding level under review as the process develops over the coming months. Consideration is also being given to the use of capital funding and capital

requirements could be accommodated from the Health Board's discretionary capital funding subject to other priorities. As an indication capital funding of £0.5m could be made available next year to support enabling ICT and equipment requirements.

In terms of developing a pipeline of proposals, it would be beneficial to agree funding for a two year period to signal the commitment to investing in and supporting improvement. On this basis, as a minimum, we are intending to provide a further £1m revenue and £0.5m capital are agreed for 2019-20, subject to the Board's agreement in due course on the 2019-20 financial plan.

**Terms:** The Board will need assurance that schemes are genuinely cash releasing and not just avoiding cost. The Fund will require measureable and timely cash out to become sustainable and for repayments to be recycled into additional projects. Successful proposals will therefore be subject to a "terms and conditions" agreement, and funding will only be released at key milestones when agreed actions and progress have been confirmed.

The funding will be fully repayable to revenue, with a maximum two year payback. In the first year, schemes will be prioritised if they can demonstrate a 50% payback in the same year. Repayment of the total investment will be non-negotiable and will be top sliced if not delivered.

**Timetable and Process**: To maximise the time for implementation and release of initial benefits in 2018-19, proposals will be submitted for consideration at the end of February 2018 for round one (to commence in April18), with a second round of applications in September 18.

In terms of evaluation, it is proposed that this will be undertaken by the current Investment Benefits Group (IBG) Appraisal Panel supplemented by clinical and operational membership. It is proposed that the application process will not be a paper based exercise and applicants will be required to present and demonstrate deliverability and efficacy of their proposals to the IBG Panel.

**Opportunities/ Project Types**: The Welsh Government Invest to Save Fund is organised around the following project types, and these directly map to ABMU's recovery and sustainability work streams:

- Asset management
- Business transformation
- ICT
- New service delivery models, including value based healthcare
- Workforce
- Procurement.

While potential investment proposals are already emerging across the Health Board as part of the forward financial plan, there are a number of projects for us to consider that have been delivered elsewhere across NHS Wales as well as the wider public sector that are referenced as part of the Invest to Save Directory or are now being taken forward by the Innovate to Save initiative (this is a partnership with Nesta, Cardiff University and the Wales Council for Voluntary Action). The Directory and the Innovate to Save web link are attached at Annex 2 for information.

**Benefits**: Projects will be required to evidence the delivery of a suite of benefits, both financial and non-financial, agreed as part of their approval. These will be regularly monitored and reported, with IBG undertaking the regular oversight of scheme progress and release of benefits. It is proposed that progress is then reported formally to this Committee twice a year. Project leads will also be required to undertake a formal post project evaluation. The Heath Board is currently considering a common benefits realisation framework and reporting tools, with the intention that these will be in place at April 2018. Further information will follow regarding this development.

### 3.0 Recommendations

The Committee is asked to support the proposed approach to the implementation and delivery of the Health Board's Investment Fund, and is asked to endorse:

- The investment criteria;
- Revenue and capital funding for an initial two year period, subject to Board approval of the final financial plans for those years;
- The repayment terms, noting that schemes will be prioritised if they demonstrate a 50% payback in year one;
- Project appraisal process;
- Biannual reporting of progress to the Committee.

### **ANNEX 1**

### **INVESTMENT CRITERIA: THE FOUR 'Ps'**

### The Problem

In this section, the organisation should define the problem that they are looking to address. In particular, we should be looking for bids which:

- A specific, well defined problem which is explained with clear evidence
- A well-defined picture of who the service user is and the extent to which they are already engaged in the project (either through user research, staff experience or co-production methods);
- A clear explanation of the service area that the challenge applies to and a brief explanation of the organisation's current strategic responsibilities.

### The Proposal

In this section the organisation should describe how it intends to go about tackling the problem. In particular we are looking for:

- A clear description of the idea that they wish to implement;
- A logical, evidence based explanation of how the proposal will create improvements in service delivery and potential savings (cashable and/or other) for the organisation. This should be backed up with evidence obtained through such measures as pilot schemes, research, evaluation of other similar proposals etc.
- An understanding of how the new idea responds to significant societal changes, including but not limited to the use of new technology;
- A clear description of how the proposal was formulated and whether or not it has been tried elsewhere (in their service area, in Wales or in general)
- An explanation of how legislation and guidance might influence the direction that the project takes.

#### The People

In this section the organisation should describe the team that will undertake the implementation of the project. In particular we are looking for:

- A team with a clear leadership and reporting structure and the right skills, knowledge and experience to deliver the project;
- A defined executive sponsor that has allocated some time and resource to the project;
- A description of any partner organisations, their role and clear, logical, strategic reasons why they are included in the project;

#### The Plan

In this section, the organisation should set out how they intend to go about implementing the idea. In particular we are looking for:

- the benchmarks against which performance (service improvement/savings) will be measured and a strategy to collect data;
- a clear project plan and timetable that allows for any development, implementation and evaluation;
- a budget that includes sufficient resources to deliver the project; and
- A description of how they intend to share any lessons, insights, best practice or tools developed as a result of the implementation.
