<p>Smoking Cessation in Pregnant women Working Group</p> <p>As part of the National Improvement Programme a working group was established in 2018 to collectively look at the whole system for smoking cessation for pregnant women, and to have a wider understanding of how referrals processed and monitored in the HMQ system. Data analysis on these referrals showed an increased drop-out rate for those who had an automatic referral. Further insight work indicated that the quality of the conversation between midwives and pregnant smokers could be improved. This led to development of a training package for midwives</p> <p>Training</p>	<p>MAMMS</p> <p>MAMMS service cannot be implanted due to funding. <p>Extensive training needs analysis undertaken with community midwives. Training needs identified a requirement to raise skills, knowledge and confidence to support and direct pregnant smokers to available services.</p> <p>40 midwives trained to deliver smoking cessation interventions to pregnant women (March and July 2019)</p> <p>Post training evaluation indicates staff feel confident, motivated and have a better understanding of Help me Quit services.</p> <p>Performance Management - CO monitoring</p> <p>Audit of handheld notes shows that CO monitoring at booking has reached 98% compliance. Those women not monitored at booking are offered CO monitoring as part of their dating scan in ANC. Further CO monitoring of pregnant women will be at 28 weeks and 34 weeks.</p> <p>In addition, women attending AN Day Assessment Unit or Antenatal Assessment Unit will be CO monitored on admission. All women admitted to the Antenatal ward are CO monitored as part of admission process and smokers will be offered further support from referral to Smoking Cessation services.</p> <p>Champions are now in place on both Ante and Post natal wards to support pregnant smokers to quit by arranging for NRT to assist adherence to “smokefree hospitals”.</p> <p>.</p>		
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
