Quality Impact Assessment Panel Assurance Report

1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this report is to provide the Quality and Safety Committee with a summary of schemes that have been considered and reviewed at the Swansea Bay University Health Board Quality Impact Assessment Panel meeting.

2. BACKGROUND

During the reporting period of June - July 2019, the Quality Impact Assessment Panel has met to review the quality impact of any emerging projects that have identified a cost saving against then.

Attendance at meetings included a range of stakeholders internal and external to the organisation:

All Service Delivery Unit 2019/20 savings schemes (Category A/B) have now been screened for quality using the Swansea Bay QIA tool. High Value Opportunities (category C) schemes have commenced being assessed with the tool.

Quality Impact Assessment Panel Review

The following section provides an overview of schemes considered and reviewed by the Quality Impact Assessment panel. Behind each scheme is a robust assessment of the key quality performance measures, the impact of the scheme on the quality of the services provided and mitigation.

• High Value Opportunities - Category C Schemes

Due to the cost savings identified against High Value Opportunity schemes, each project will use the QIA tool to assess the impact against quality. The following schemes have been reviewed by the panel during this reporting period:

On-going QIA process:

The Service Delivery Units have identified new savings schemes as part of their financial plans. The newly formed Delivery Support Team (DST) has reviewed the emerging schemes and ranked them into A (action now) B (requires further assurance) C (DST to gain further information) categories. The DST has advised that schemes noted as A's are required to assess their impact on quality using the Swansea Bay QIA process.

3. GOVERNANCE AND RISK ISSUES

The QIA panel has now reviewed all Service Delivery Unit 2019/20 financial plans (category A/B). As stated within the terms of reference, QIAs that are approved by Panel are reviewed and reported on a quarterly basis by the Panel (risk score of 8+) or through local governance arrangements. Lower scored schemes are included as they were reported in previous reports for information and completeness.
