Lymphoedema Network Wales Annual Report 20-21 1. INTRODUCTION

Lymphoedema Network Wales consists of the seven Health Board Lymphoedema Services and a small but growing National Lymphoedema Team. It is this National Team that is hosted by SBUHB on behalf of NHS Wales. An agreed Memorandum of Understanding is in place with all Health Boards. The governance structure requires Lymphoedema Network Wales National Team to deliver an Annual Report to the Management Board and Quality and Safety Committee for noting and assurance.

2. BACKGROUND


Lymphoedema Network Wales (LNW) Annual Report highlights the following:

- Impact of Covid19 on clinics and deployment of staff across Wales;
- Benefits of Virtual clinics to ensure patients with the greatest need are seen face to face with the added benefit of using LYMPROM©- Lymphoedema Patient Reported Outcome Measures;
- Activity for 20-21 was 36,187 contacts which is very similar to last year's 36,759this is positive and demonstrates the continued adaptability of services to see
 patients where is best for all i.e. community, outpatients or virtually;
- Referrals to the national service was 41% less from 7,687 to 4,571- this is worrying
 as already we are seeing more complex patients being referred with large volumes
 of oedema and more complex wounds;
- The research agenda continued with several articles being published- The national team also continued to present locally, nationally and internationally via virtual methods;
- Local education continued albeit virtually with 292 people attending Lymphoedema courses thus still income generating;
- New programmes of work including the Cellulitis Improvement Programme commenced which is proving to be releasing benefits in patient outcomes and costs. The three team members are working through all hospitals in Wales and already have gained support from Directors of Finance and Welsh Government to speed up the programme benefits;
- Project B is now up scaled throughout Wales and patients can now access their compression garments in a timely and cost efficient way throughout Wales;
- Lastly, On the Ground Clinical Education (OGEP) which is phase two of the Value Based Business Case is now being prioritised in three Health Boards and again benefits are being realised. SBUHB was one of the first Health Boards to commence in December 2020 and the results are very promising in patient outcomes, releasing staff time and a reduction in consumable costs.

3. GOVERNANCE AND RISK ISSUES

SBUHB are responsible for the governance of the Lymphoedema Network Wales National Team. All Mandatory training of the team are completes as are Personal Development Plans. Risks of the Network are managed via the LNW Strategy Board and escalated to Welsh Government NHS Wales Executive Board.

The Governance structure is highlighted in Figure 1.



4. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

There are no financial implications of hosting LNW National Team. All funding is received via Welsh Government and the NHS Wales Health Collaborative. The budget at the end of year is zero. Any underspend is released back to SBUHB. In 20-21 the underspend was around 40K.
