I refer to your further query in relation to our Freedom of Information Act response which was sent to you on 10<sup>th</sup> December 2019.

In our response we noted that the figures for admissions under "anxiety" increased between 2017 and 2018. We stated this was due to a change in systems and the way we recorded the information. We explained the term "anxiety state" had only been an admission diagnosis since 2018 which may have contributed to this.

On 19<sup>th</sup> December 2019 you responded to us, asking us to clarify how and why our systems had changed, and whether the jump in 2018 may be due to a change in the way the admission diagnosis was judged or recorded.

After further investigation by our Information team, it seems that the one of the "free type" fields that we had used to search our data includes information that doesn't relate specifically to the diagnosis of the patient, which has contributed to the inflated figures we provided to you in our initial response. To retrieve data from our A&E system a search is undertaken via a keyword(s) which will filter all the attendances that include this word(s). It has come to light, however, that one of the fields used could contain information irrelevant to the attendance reason. As a result of this, the data we have provided includes some figures that are not related to an anxiety diagnosis at all, as they may have had the word "anxious" or "anxiety" in the free type box.

Therefore, we have recalculated our data excluding that particular free text field. Please find below the revised figures and please accept our apologies for any confusion caused.

Where fewer than 5 has been indicated we are unable to provide you with the exact number of patients as due to the low numbers, there is a potential risk of identifying individuals if this was disclosed. We are therefore withholding this detail under Section 40(2) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000. This information is protected by the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) and Data Protection Act 2018 and its disclosure would be contrary to the data protection principles and constitute as unfair and unlawful processing in regard to Articles 5, 6, and 9 of GDPR. This exemption is absolute and therefore there is no requirement to apply the public interest test.
