I refer to your Freedom of Information Act Request acknowledged by ourselves on 7<sup>th</sup> August 2020. Your request sought information relating to Fabry and Gaucher's disease and Hunter's Syndrome.

## 1. Within your Health Board, how many patients currently have a diagnosis for;

You clarified on 17<sup>th</sup> September 2020 that you are looking for numbers of patients admitted to hospital with one of the below diagnoses.

- **a. Fabry Disease** <5\* patients
- **b. Gaucher Disease** see above. Fabry and Gaucher Disease are coded using the same clinical code within our systems, therefore we cannot differentiate between the two.
- c. MPS II (Hunter Syndrome) 0 patients
- 2. Of the patients above, how many have been newly diagnosed within the past 3 months for
  - a. Fabry Disease
  - **b.** Gaucher Disease

Any other treatment for Fabry disease [please state which treatments] Any other treatment for Gaucher disease [please state which treatments] To obtain this information would involve a manual trawl and search of records which we have estimated would significantly exceed the 18 hours limit set down by the FOI Act as the reasonable limit. Section 12 of the FOI Act provides that we are not obliged to spend in excess of 18 hours in any sixty day period locating, retrieving and identifying information in order to deal with a request for information and therefore we are withholding this information at this time.

## 4. Of the patients being treated for Fabry disease can you please provide the numbers of patients being treated through homecare?

We do not have any patients on our Primary Care prescribing system receiving any of the above medications.

\*Where fewer than 5 has been indicated we are unable to provide you with the exact number of patients as due to the low numbers, there is a potential risk of identifying individuals if this was disclosed. We are therefore withholding this detail under Section 40(2) of the Freedom of Information Act 2000. This information is protected by the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) and Data Protection Act 2018 and its disclosure would be contrary to the data protection principles and constitute as unfair and unlawful processing in regard to Articles 5, 6, and 9 of GDPR. This exemption is absolute and therefore there is no requirement to apply the public interest test.
