I refer to your Freedom of Information Act Request acknowledged by ourselves on 11^{th} August 2020. Your request sought information relating to NICE Cold Homes Guidance.

On 25th August 2020 you clarified "primary health and home are practitioners" to mean "health and social care professionals who provide services to patients in the primary care and community settings – including, but not limited to, GPs, district nurses, Allied Health Professionals and social care staff."

1. Does the Swansea Bay University Health Board have procedures or policies in place to ensure primary health and home care practitioners assess the heating needs of people who use their services at least once a year, as recommended by National Institute for Health and Care Excellence guidance on Excess winter deaths and illness and the health risks associated with cold homes (NG6)?

Swansea Bay Health Board does not have specific procedures or policies in place relating to the heating of patient's homes. However, patients that are newly engaging or in place on a health care professional caseload within Primary Care would be subject to a holistic assessment where appropriate. Any concerns or issues relating to the heating situation in the patient's home would be acted on accordingly.

2. Does the Swansea Bay University Health Board record or audit compliance with the recommendation referenced in question 1 among primary health and home care practitioners?

Does the Swansea Bay University Health Board have procedures or policies in place to ensure that, when a patient is discharged from a health or social care setting, an assessment is carried out into whether they are likely to be vulnerable to the cold and if action is needed to make their home warm enough for them to return to, as recommended by National Institute for Health and Care Excellence guidance on Excess winter deaths and illness and the health risks associated with cold homes (NG6)?
