I refer to your Freedom of Information Act Request acknowledged by ourselves on 22nd December 2020. Your request sought information relating to cervical cancer and smear tests.

1. How many invitation letters for cervical smear tests were sent out each year for the last five years (2015-2020 inclusive, if possible)?

I can confirm that Swansea Bay Health Board does not hold this information. Cervical smear tests are organised and coordinated via Cervical Screening Wales (part of Public Health Wales) and this information would be held by their organisation. 2. With the same stipulations regarding years/ medical facilities, how many people were these letters sent to each year?

4. What data is collected and/or stored by the board or to the board's knowledge regarding cervical cancer patients? Is any data collected and/or regarding gender and gender at birth? If so what data is collected and/or stored?

You clarified on 22nd December 2020 that you would like to know if SBU record the birth gender of cervical cancer patients or is it aware of others doing so.

There is no data specifically collected for the purposes of analysing birth gender for cervical cancer patients by SBU. Gender is recorded in patient notes and on the All Wales Cancer database (Canisc) in accordance with the NHS Wales data dictionary definitions as below;

There is no data specifically collected for the purposes of analysing prevalence of cervical cancer amongst transgender men by SBU. Gender is recorded in patient notes and on the All Wales Cancer database (Canisc) in accordance with the NHS Wales data dictionary definitions as above.
