1. How many clinics in the health board deal with diagnosing patients with ADHD?

There are no specific clinics which deal with diagnosing patients with ADHD.

2. How many clinicians are qualified to do this?

There are 9 Adult Mental Health Consultants who are qualified to diagnose ADHD.

3. How long is the waiting list for both children and adults?

Children's Service

I can confirm that Cwm Taf Morgannwg University Health Board hosts the Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service (CAMHS). This service provides specialist mental health services to children and young people. CAMHS provides community mental health services for 1.2million people, covering the areas of Merthyr, Rhondda Cynon Taf, Cardiff and Vale, Bridgend, Neath Port Talbot and Swansea.
