You asked:

1. What antenatal advice does the health board routinely give to mothers about infant skincare including the bathing of babies?

Community midwives would not routinely provide antenatal advice on bathing or infant skincare unless specifically asked.

The obstetric Unit don't encourage babies to be bathed daily. They advise that their skin flora needs to adjust to their home environment and so bathing is not encouraged for that reason too. Water and cotton wool recommended for nappy changes and not wipes.

2. What postpartum advice does the health board routinely give to mothers about infant skincare including the bathing of babies?

Postnatally, the advice provided, is not to bath the baby until at least day 5 and to avoid using perfumed products if not plain water. Women are often advised to "top and tail" the baby, as daily bathing is not necessary.
